The Tups (Young Rams) used as grass cutters at Ridgegate have been known to frequent the Green Bank by the Hut and the top of the West Dam. They are usually deployed on the South Dam bank.

Contact a committee member to let them know the issue. Avoid any confrontation. Report all incidents of violence and aggression. Recommendations:	
		Carry a mobile phone if possible. Avoid lone fishing. Keep valuables out of sight if possible.
